Pictured are three of the trophies won by Issaquah Garden Club, representing First Place awards in District-wide competition. These are traveling trophies.

The clock was awarded for our Yearbook, which also won at the state level. It was donated by Past WSFGC President, and Past ELWD Director June Willard. The pedestal bowl, donated by Past Director Ruth Sieverts, was awarded for our Newsletter, which also won at the State level.

The large metal trophy was awarded for our Civic Involvement. The trophy was created by IGC member Betty Zink and donated by former Issaquah Garden Club President and Past District Director Ann Chandler. Civic Involvement includes our Arbor Day project, Blue Star Memorial Marker festivities, Garden Therapy, Issaquah History Museum native garden, work with community Youth, Pea Patch garden with donation of food to needy, and Bellevue Botanical Garden Native Garden efforts. (We also won a State Award for Civic Involvement.)

IGC was also awarded a brown ceramic trophy (not pictured) created by Past District Director Lucille Massey. This was awarded for IGC promotion of Floral Design.

IGC won State Awards and \$10 each for Birds and for Garden Therapy. Our Garden Club was also awarded \$500 from National Garden Clubs, Inc., for our Native Trail at Bellevue Botanical Garden.

These awards represent a fraction of all the great work accomplished by our club. Even if a member didn't physically work on these various projects, just by them paying dues and being supportive, a lot can be accomplished. A big thank you goes out to all of our members for last year's work. Each member is encouraged to take an active part in at least one or more outside special project as well as taking a fair turn on the Board.
